Summary: The Los Feliz Neighborhood Council (LFNC) supports this motion seeking to protect low-income renters from the financial burden of building decarbonization and other climate-change-related modifications. While it is critical that Los Angeles do its part to address the global climate crisis and reduce the city's overall carbon emissions, we must take care to ensure that there is equitable access to energy efficiency programs so that low-income families and individuals are not left behind. Additionally, renter protections should be updated and strictly enforced to prevent unnecessary displacement and undue financial burden. The energy and housing justice principles outlined in this motion would go a long way towards protecting vulnerable stakeholders during this important transition. Los Feliz is a community of over 75% renters and the majority of homes built in this neighborhood are over half a century old. As our community moves into the 21st century in accordance with LA's Green New Deal, we must take care to center the voices and concerns of our low-income neighbors. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the LFNC SUPPORTS the motion instructing the Climate Emergency Mobilization Office (CEMO) and other city departments to align their decarbonization efforts with the aforementioned energy and housing justice principles.
