Title: Rental Transparency and Accountability Ordinance / Uniform Screening Criteria / Tenant Screening Process / Discrimination

Summary:

On April 13th, 2022 at a Brown Act compliant meeting, the NoHo Neighborhood Council voted 13-0-0 in support of Council File 22-0279 calling for a Rental Transparency and Accountability Ordinance for the City of Los Angeles.

During this unprecedented housing crisis, it is of utmost importance that all Angelenos have equal access to housing opportunities. No prospective tenant of a rental property should be denied that opportunity on the basis of the tenant's race, sexuality, gender identity, ethnic background, disability status, citizenship status, or any other trait that does not affect their quality as a tenant. Without this ordinance in place, landlords are free to discriminate against prospective tenants without having to provide any reason for their decision. This inevitably leads to implicit biases affecting the tenant selection process, which exacerbates the inequality in housing access for people of different socioeconomic backgrounds and identity groups. This ordinance would be a step in the right direction towards strengthening protections for renters and ensuring equal access to housing for all Angelenos.
