

MOTION

In the case of *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association Inc. v. Bruen*, the plaintiffs challenged a New York state law that required individuals to show that they have specific threats to their safety to demonstrate a need for a concealed carry permit to carry a concealed weapon outside their homes.

Though the law was rescinded and no longer in force in the State of New York, and therefore the case was moot, the United States Supreme Court chose to take up the controversy in the case. This week, the Court announced its unprecedented, unjustifiable, and politically-motivated expansion of its interpretation of the Second Amendment in overturning the New York law.

The Court's decision, which is based on an interpretation of the Second Amendment that the late Nixon-appointed Chief Justice of the United States Warren Burger had described as a "fraud on the American public," will undoubtedly have wide-ranging impacts on firearms restrictions around the country.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council REQUEST that the City Attorney report on the implications for the City's gun violence prevention laws of the Supreme Court ruling against New York's gun control rules in *New York State Rifle & Pistol Association Inc. v. Bruen* and produce ordinances to remedy any Constitutional defects upon the publication of any decision of the Supreme Court on gun control laws.
