Dear Councilmembers:

Atwater Village is a community that is highly impacted by the lack of coordination between LASAN and other government entities. We implore you to find a way to work across the various jurisdictions to be able to clean our public spaces effectively and efficiently. We enter and leave our community through these areas, which are often filled with abandoned carts and illegally dumped waste. This often includes graffiti, mattresses, couches, doors, carpets, toilets, electrical waste, construction material, other furniture, dead animals, shopping carts, and miscellaneous debris. Our community members have reported these issues via 311 only to find the tickets “closed” without resolution due to jurisdictional issues. The community of Pico Union should receive the same City services that are provided to all other City residents in a timely manner.

Most LA residents expect that 311 and its associated app address illegal dumping; however, it does not adequately serve our community. Providing a system to report and solve the issues along the Pico Union corridor would create a positive image for the City. Solving the lack of services is essential to our community members' public safety and quality of life. We support all efforts that would enable the City, Bureau of Sanitation to provide services on multi-jurisdictional properties with Caltrans, LA County, LA County Flood Control, and USACE.
