SUBJECT

Request to adopt the following report and approve and execute the First Amendment to Contract DA-5575 with Global Access Supply for the maintenance of the Airfield Lighting Control Monitoring System at Los Angeles International Airport, extending the contract term by five years to October 24, 2030, and increasing the contract authority by \$1,450,000 for a new not-to-exceed amount of \$1,861,000.

DISCUSSION

1. Purpose

The proposed amendment will allow Global Access Supply to continue providing maintenance and technical support of the Airfield Lighting Control Monitoring System (ALCMS) at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX).

2. Prior Related Actions/History of Board Actions

- **August 18, 2022 – Resolution No. 27565 (DA-5575)**

The Board of Airport Commissioners approved the award of a three-year contract to Global Access Supply for the maintenance of the ALCMS at LAX, for an amount not to exceed \$411,000. This contract expires on October 24, 2025.

3. Background

The ALCMS installed at LAX allows Air Traffic Controllers to control and monitor the operations of airfield and taxiway lighting systems, including allowing them to turn on and

adjust the brightness levels according to visibility and weather conditions. By allowing adjustments that provide clear and consistent visual guidance for pilots and ground personnel, the ALCMS helps to prevent accidents and incidents on the airfield, especially during inclement weather and poor visibility. Global Access Supply replaces and updates the ALCMS hardware and software as needed.

The ALCMS installed at LAX is a proprietary system and must be maintained by the manufacturer or an authorized service provider to preserve the manufacturer's warranty. The ALCMS manufacturer designated Global Access Supply as the sole Master Stocking Distributor of services and products necessary to maintain the ALCMS and has been instrumental in minimizing service interruptions.

4. Current Action/Rationale

The Facilities Management Division (FMD) requests an increase of the current contract authority and an extension of the contract term for five additional years.

Los Angeles World Airports has fully expended the current authorized contract amount. Initial costs surpassed projections within the first two years due to essential upgrades to computer systems and monitors.

Los Angeles World Airports will continue using the current ALCMS for the foreseeable future, and Global Access Supply is the only vendor authorized to maintain, repair and provide replacement parts for the ALCMS.

5. Fiscal Impact

Costs incurred under this contract will be recovered through landing fees, terminal rates and charges, and non-aeronautical revenues.

APPROPRIATIONS

Funds for this contract are available in the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Los Angeles World Airports Operating Budget in LAX Cost Center 1150073 - Facility Technical Services (FTS) Building Field Electric Shop, Commitment Item 520 - Contractual Services. Funding for subsequent years will be requested as part of the annual budget process.

STANDARD PROVISIONS

The Board is hereby requested to adopt staff's determination that this item, as a continuing administrative, maintenance and personnel-related activity, is exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements pursuant to Article II, Section 2.f of the Los Angeles City CEQA Guidelines.
