We specifically ask that the City Council take action to: expand the number of City Councilmembers, remove City Councilmembers' direct discretionary power over land use decisions in their districts, reform City Council rules concerning lobbyists (as proposed by the City Ethics Commission in CF 22-0560), and establish a truly independent redistricting commission (as called for in CF 21-1472). We also encourage other activities that address the unethical culture that has come to define City Hall in recent years.

In light of the now infamous leaked recording from a 2021 strategy discussion on redistricting between Councilmembers Martinez, de Leon and Cedillo we demand urgent action to begin to restore faith in our City's elected representatives and democratic institutions. The portions of the recording already released are evidence of intentional violation of the law during the redistricting process. Specifically, Section 5 of the Voting Rights Acts requires that redistricting changes must be proven to not have a discriminatory purpose or effect. In the recording released, we see clear evidence of an overt discriminatory purpose in redistricting proposals which were subsequently adopted. This opens up the city to liability and makes urgent the need for a truly independent redistricting commission. We also believe that the City Council desperately needs expansion. We are the most underrepresented City Council in the entire nation with a constituent to representative ratio of 260,000 to 1. This concentration of power in too few hands drives the

favor-brokering and horse trading on display. Angelenos desperately need diverse representative government, not those who cling to racism in justification for their policymaking.

Lastly, we worry that the comments on the recordings are evidence not just of bigotry, but also evidence of our elected officials being incredibly out of touch with their constituents. We ask that City Council, to increase accessibility, implement hybrid meetings that allow for people to make virtual comments during meetings and allow for the public to share space and hold accountable our elected officials during deliberations of the public's business.
