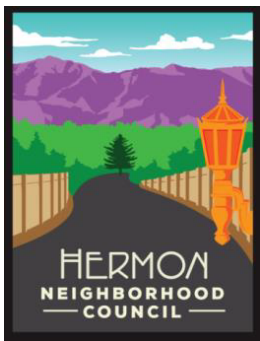

Failure of these representatives to resign continues to erode any remaining trust we have in the leadership of this City. This is not the leadership that Angelenos deserve.

In terms of our community of Hermon and the Hermon Neighborhood Council, we are extremely disturbed and saddened by the conduct of our Councilmember Kevin De León. Hermon prides itself in being a diverse and inclusive place. All are welcome in our community regardless of ethnicity, race, class, gender, and sexual orientation. Following the controversy and shame that plagued Council District 14 due to the actions of the previous councilmember, we were hopeful that De León would restore honor to this office. Now we feel betrayed and sickened by De León's participation and lack of intervention in this racist, classist, and defamatory discussion that has diminished our trust and belief in our City representation.

It is time for our City to heal. It is well past time for Kevin de León and Gil Cedillo to resign.
