Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

The RV safety, medical, and associated sanitation problems in Los Angeles are well-documented. This motion strives to remove unsafe vehicles while still respecting the rights of the owners. It furthermore purports to provide wrap-around services so that the people being displaced will have a head start.

This Vehicle Recycling Program (VRP) can and should be enacted. The report of the Commission Investigation Division of the Board of Police Commissioners. says that \$1.4 million dollars is available and the cost per RV to safely remove would be on the order of 2,500 dollars each. , they are stating that between 500 and 1000 RV removals a year are possible. If we are actually looking at the 4,000 problematic RVs (claimed by LAHSA) currently in Los Angeles, this would be a great beginning.
