NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Dear Mayor Bass:

On May 16, 2023, our Board voted 11-0-0 to recommend the following areas as priorities for monetary allocations in the 2023-2024 City budget. These priorities are based on the needs which our stakeholders have brought to us at meetings, via telephone calls, and e-mail:

- Building and Safety – increased funding for code enforcement in conjunction with the Dept. of City Planning
- Bureau of Sanitation – increased funding for weekly street cleaning in areas that have not previously had posted cleanings: Districts 1, 2, 3, and 6 of the Harbor Gateway North Neighborhood Council area (see our attached map)
- Bureau of Sanitation - increased funding for the removal and prosecution of illegally dumped items and installation of deterrent measures at key locations:
  - 1) 168<sup>th</sup> Street under the I-110 (District 1)
  - 2) Estrella between 164<sup>th</sup> Street and 168<sup>th</sup> Street (District 1)
  - 3) Denver between Gardena Blvd. and 168<sup>th</sup> Street (District 1)
  - 4) Alondra Blvd. under the I-110 (District 1 and 2)

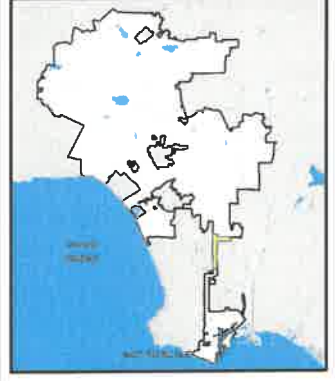
- 6) Utilize Vision Zero funding to resolve safety issues on 135<sup>th</sup> Street in front of the 135<sup>th</sup> Street Elementary School (District 4)
- 7) Signage and other traffic calming measures:
  - a) Every intersection in the District 5 area (see map) to prevent cars doing wheelies or donuts
  - b) Hoover Street from El Segundo to 120<sup>th</sup> Street to control speeding (District 5)
  - c) Laconia Blvd. (600 block to 800 block) to control speeding (District 5)
  - d) Laconia Blvd. from Ainsworth Street west to Vermont Avenue – installation of bollards/barriers to prevent parking between yellow lines in the middle of the street; paint slanted/diagonal parking lines on north and south sides of Laconia Blvd. to allow/accommodate residential and tenant parking (District 5)
  - e) Ainsworth Street, east side from Laconia Place to Laconia Blvd. (signage saying “No parking anytime – Tow Away Zone”) (District 5)

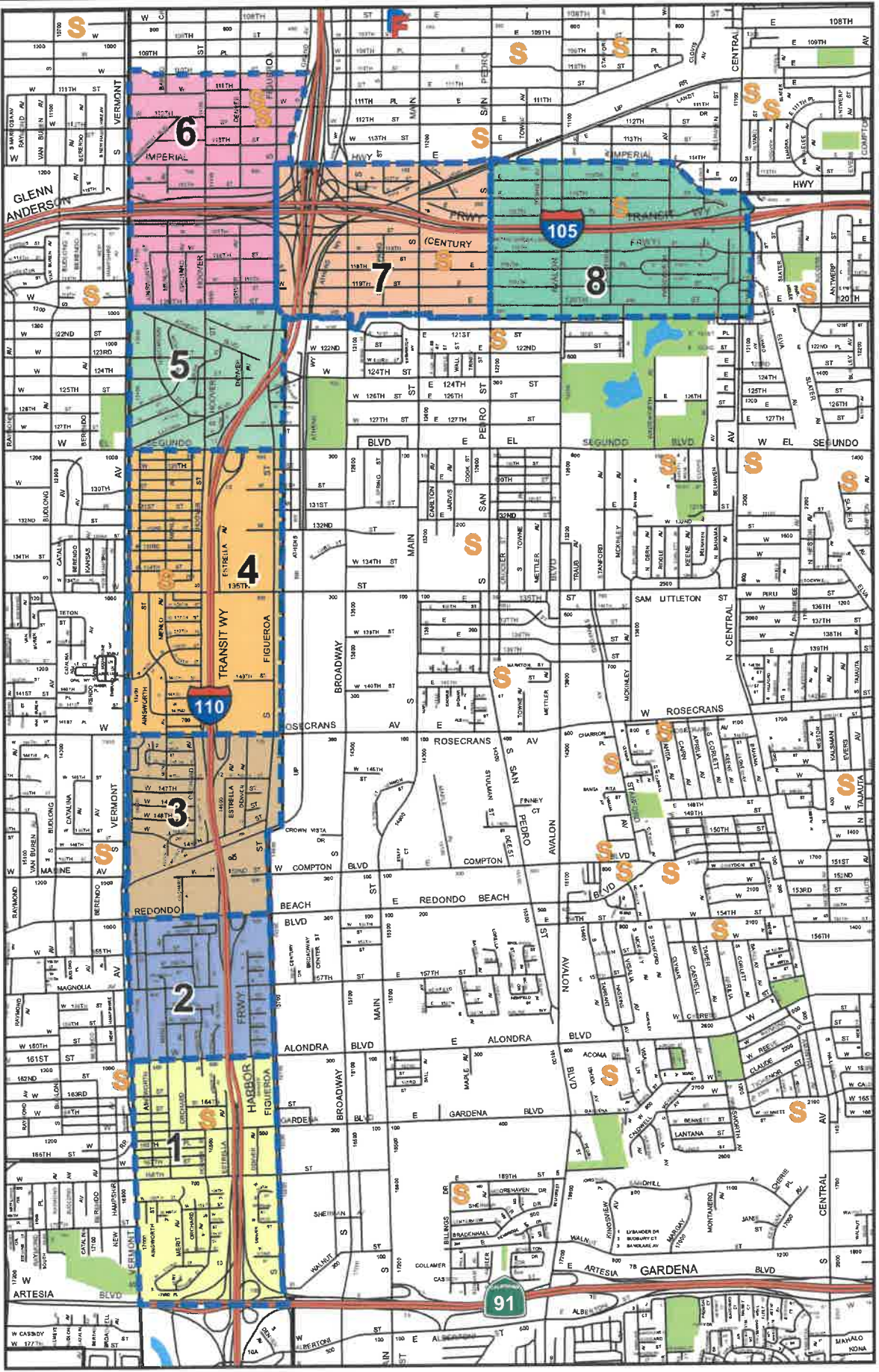
