Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council, SVANC, in its regular meeting of September 12, 2023, passed the following community impact statement by a vote of: 12 yes, 0 no, 3 absent, 0 recused, and 0 ineligible.

The Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council agrees that “a number of City departments that do work within the public right-of-way, sidewalks, and parkways” and that “for several years, elected officials and the public have lodged complaints about the lack of coordination between LADOT and the Department of Public Works, leading to the design and build of infrastructure projects that may lack coordination or integration of review and approval processes.”

SVANC supports the City Council asking for “recommendations and best practices that will streamline and implement better coordination between the departments and bureaus who build and maintain public infrastructure in the public right-of-way, sidewalks, and parking by evaluating reducing the number of steps involved in the approval process, providing clear guidance to the public, and appropriate timelines for implementation.”
