With the potential reduction in Victim of Crimes Act (VOCA) funding, the City's already under-resourced victims and survivor service providers are facing dramatic cuts that will lead to substantial reductions in staffing and programs, and likely more vulnerable Angelenos falling into homelessness.


The Fifth Council District is deeply fortunate to be home to two of the leading Domestic and Intimate Partner Violence (DV/IPV) providers in Los Angeles - Jewish Family Services, and the Center for the Pacific Asian Family. 

In the midst of such programmatic and financial uncertainty for victims and survivor services, the Fifth Council Office is committed to ensuring that DV/IPV survivors and their families, as well as the organizations that support them, are appropriately resourced and supported.

**I THEREFORE MOVE** that \$50,000 in the General City Purposes Fund No. 100/56, Account No. 000903, Council Community Projects (CD5 Homeless Housing Interventions) be allocated to Jewish Family Services (JFS), to be utilized to support operational and capital costs for the JFS Hope confidential DV Shelter located in the Fifth Council District.

**I FURTHER MOVE** that \$50,000 in the General City Purposes Fund No. 100/56, Account No. 000903, Council Community Projects (CD5 Homeless Housing Interventions) be allocated to the Center for the Pacific Asian Family (CPAF), to be utilized to support CPAF's flexible financial assistance and operational costs for the confidential DV/IPV shelter located in the Fifth Council District.
