

GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to replacing the visitor tag currently in use at City Hall.

Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Krekorian – Padilla):

DIRECT the Los Angeles Police Department’s Security Services Division and the Department of General Services to identify a reusable, non-sticky visitor tag or badge for visitors at City Hall, to replace the single-use “visitor” stickers currently in use.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

On October 8 2024, your Committee considered a Motion (Krekorian – Padilla) relative to replacing the visitor tag currently in use at City Hall. According to the Motion, currently, when a person visits City Hall, they must go through a security screening and are given a single-use “visitor” sticker that they must wear while in the building. These stickers are single use, which creates unnecessary trash. In addition, some visitors remove them and stick them on walls or other surfaces, requiring additional work by the Department of General Services to remove them. These stickers should be replaced with something that is non-sticky and reusable. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the Motion. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
