

RULES, ELECTIONS AND INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT and ORDINANCE FIRST CONSIDERATION relative to calling a special election on March 5, 2024, for a minimum wage for employees working at certain healthcare facilities, and consolidating this special election with the City's Primary Nominating Election and the State Primary Election to be held on the same date.

Recommendation for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

PRESENT and ADOPT the accompanying ORDINANCE, dated August 14, 2023, calling a Special Election on Tuesday, March 5, 2024, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City of Los Angeles a certified initiative ordinance regarding a minimum wage for employees working at certain healthcare facilities, and consolidating this Special Election with the City's Primary Nominating Election and the State Primary Election to be held on the same date, unless proponents request to withdraw the initiative from the ballot.

SUMMARY

At its meeting held on September 15, 2023, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a City Attorney report and draft Ordinance relative to calling a Special Election on Tuesday, March 5, 2024, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City of Los Angeles a certified initiative ordinance regarding a minimum wage for employees working at certain healthcare facilities, and consolidating this Special Election with the City's Primary Nominating Election and the State Primary Election to be held on the same date.

After an opportunity for public comment was held, the Committee moved to approve the draft Ordinance, unless proponents request to withdraw the initiative from the ballot. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
