**BUREAU OF CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION – COMMENTS ON THE MAYOR’S PROPOSED
BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-26**

The Bureau of Contract Administration (Bureau) has reviewed the Mayor’s Proposed Budget and appreciates the opportunity to provide an overview of potential changes to core services for the coming year. We recognize the challenges of the City’s current fiscal situation and the difficult decisions the Mayor had to make to present a balanced budget. The Proposed Budget eliminates 22 vacant and 31 filled positions, or 14% of what is currently authorized. While the position eliminations were spread across divisions, the largest impact was in the enforcement of labor standards.

We are presenting for your consideration our request to preserve as many filled positions as possible and avoid laying off those employees who not only help provide services to Angelenos daily, but also make up the future of this Bureau and our City. To support this request, our proposal consists of alternative position eliminations and expense reductions that will fully cover the cost of these positions. Below is a summary of how these positions directly impact services the Bureau provides.

EXECUTIVE OFFICE AND ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES (including Budget and Systems)

Position Eliminations: 4 vacant and 7 filled (33%)

The Bureau has two very distinct components between Inspection and Compliance, and the elimination of the Assistant Director for Inspection creates a significant gap in ensuring consistency and development of cross-divisional inspection practices and policies. The Administrative Services Division also provides executive, budgetary, systems support and revenue collection for the Bureau. The Proposed Budget’s 50% reduction for the systems group will impact its ability to operate and maintain core systems including an Online Certified Payroll System, Inspection Dispatch scheduling system, and Construction Payments System. With a majority of Bureau staff working exclusively in the field, systems must also ensure the availability of technology such as laptops and smart phones for inspectors.

CITYWIDE LABOR STANDARDS ENFORCEMENT (Office of Wage Standards)

Position Eliminations: 7 vacant and 13 filled (48%)

OWS enforces the City’s Minimum Wage, Paid Sick Leave, and Fair Work Week, and is responsible for administration of the Hotel Worker Protection Ordinance. The Proposed Budget eliminated 13 of 20 positions in the Minimum Wage Investigations section. As proposed, we may not be able to accept all cases and it could take 3-4 years before we are able to help workers resolve their wage complaint. It will also make it very challenging to absorb new workload from the forthcoming Hotel Worker Minimum Wage, including enforcement of the new wage, review of hardship waivers, and administration of the



housekeeping training component. The Fair Work Week section also lost key positions which will make it difficult to absorb new workload for any expansion to Fast Food workers. The Proposed Budget eliminated the Division Manager who oversees all facets of the OWS, provides key policy guidance to the Mayor and City Council on labor standards enforcement, and liaises regularly with the worker and business community to ensure fair and equitable implementation of the ordinances.

CONTRACTUAL LABOR STANDARDS AND BUSINESS OUTREACH

Position Eliminations: 2 vacant and 9 filled (19%)

The Office of Contract Compliance (OCC) enforces ordinances that protect workers and provide business opportunity in City procurement. This includes enforcement of Prevailing and Living Wage, as well as administration of Project Labor Agreements, contracting ordinances, Business Inclusion, Certifications, Local Business Preference, and business development such as Community Level Contracting. The proposed Budget eliminated the Division Manager who oversees all elements of the OCC including providing key policy guidance to the Mayor and City Council, and all City Departments on contract labor standards and business development. This also includes interfacing with the three proprietary departments - POLA, LAWA, & DWP to preserve citywide procurement consistency.

CONSTRUCTION INSPECTION

Position Eliminations: 9 vacant and 2 filled (4%)

The Bureau's Construction Inspection Divisions provide inspection on both private development permits and City funded infrastructure projects, as well as support for the Proprietary Departments. The Bureau believes it can absorb these eliminations, but will monitor workload and report back as needed. However, the Proposed Budget also eliminated a Civil Engineer who ensures compliance with applicable federal, state, and local laws on construction sites and coordinates the Bureau's Tailgate Safety meeting program.

OFFICE OF PROCUREMENT (EXHIBIT H)

The Bureau applauds the Mayor on her leadership and recognition of a partnership and consolidation of the Office of Procurement within the Bureau. An overwhelming majority of the OOP staff appear designated for elimination in this budget. The Bureau believes there are opportunities with a potential consolidation and reimagining of the OOP's mission within BCA and welcomes consideration of a strategic plan. This can include consolidated outreach and training on City procurement and in advance of the 2028 Games, leveraging RAMP and prioritizing developments that improve the customer experience on procurement and certification, development of procurement policy that advances opportunities for small, local, diverse businesses, and brings clarity to departments on procurement guidance and advice.


PROPOSED SOLUTIONS

In total, the Bureau is proposing to restore 27 filled and 3 vacant positions at a total cost of \$2,499,909. Note that vacant positions were factored at 9 months funding. A more detailed breakdown of the proposed offset is attached which includes:

- Elimination of 2 positions that are funded by General Fund subsidized Special Funds
- Shifting 12 Inspection and Compliance staff from General Fund to Special Funded positions
- Reductions to Overtime, Hiring Hall, and Contractual Services accounts.

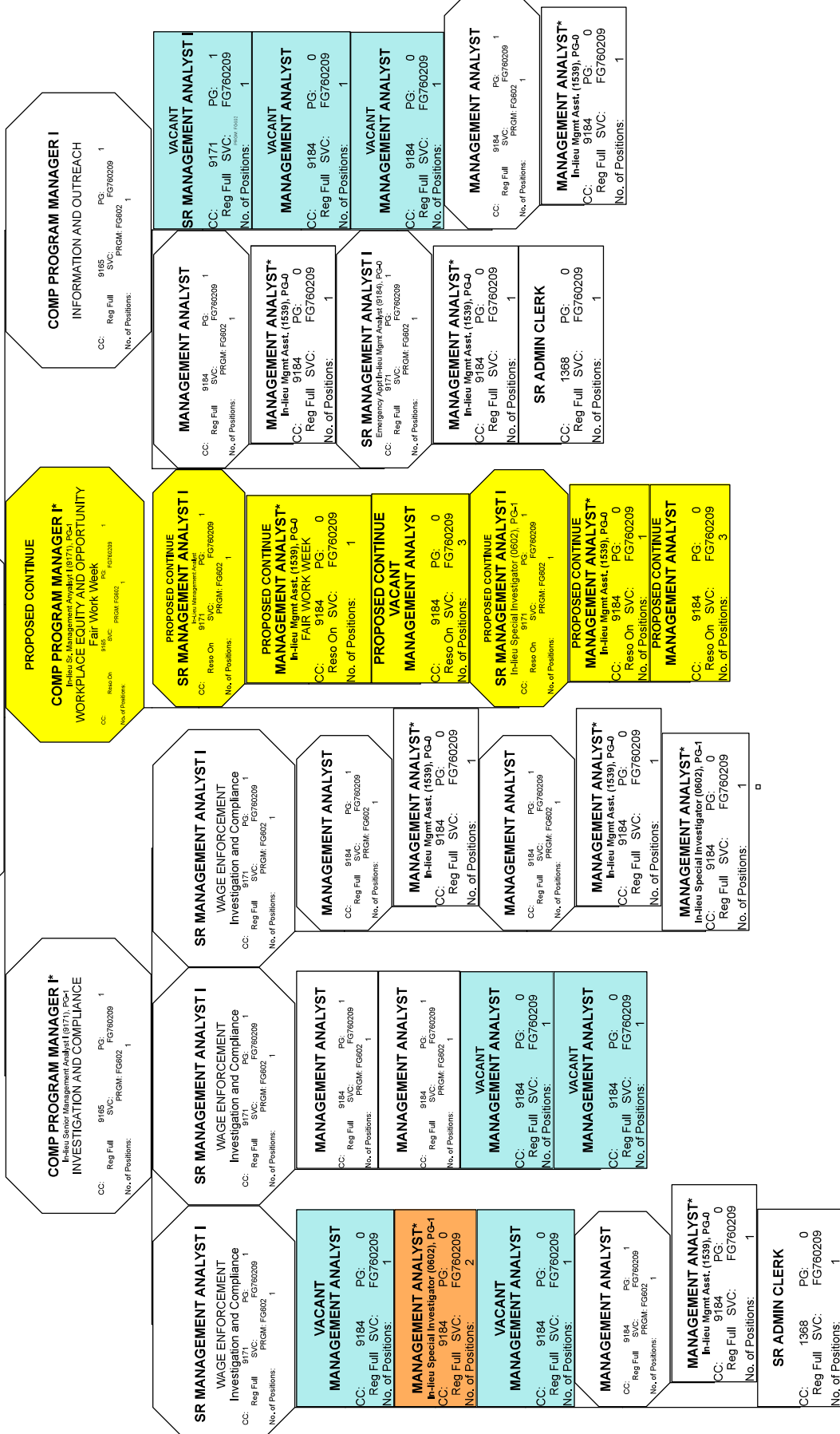


Bureau of Contract Administration ADOPTED ORGANIZATIONAL CHART Fiscal Year 2024-2025

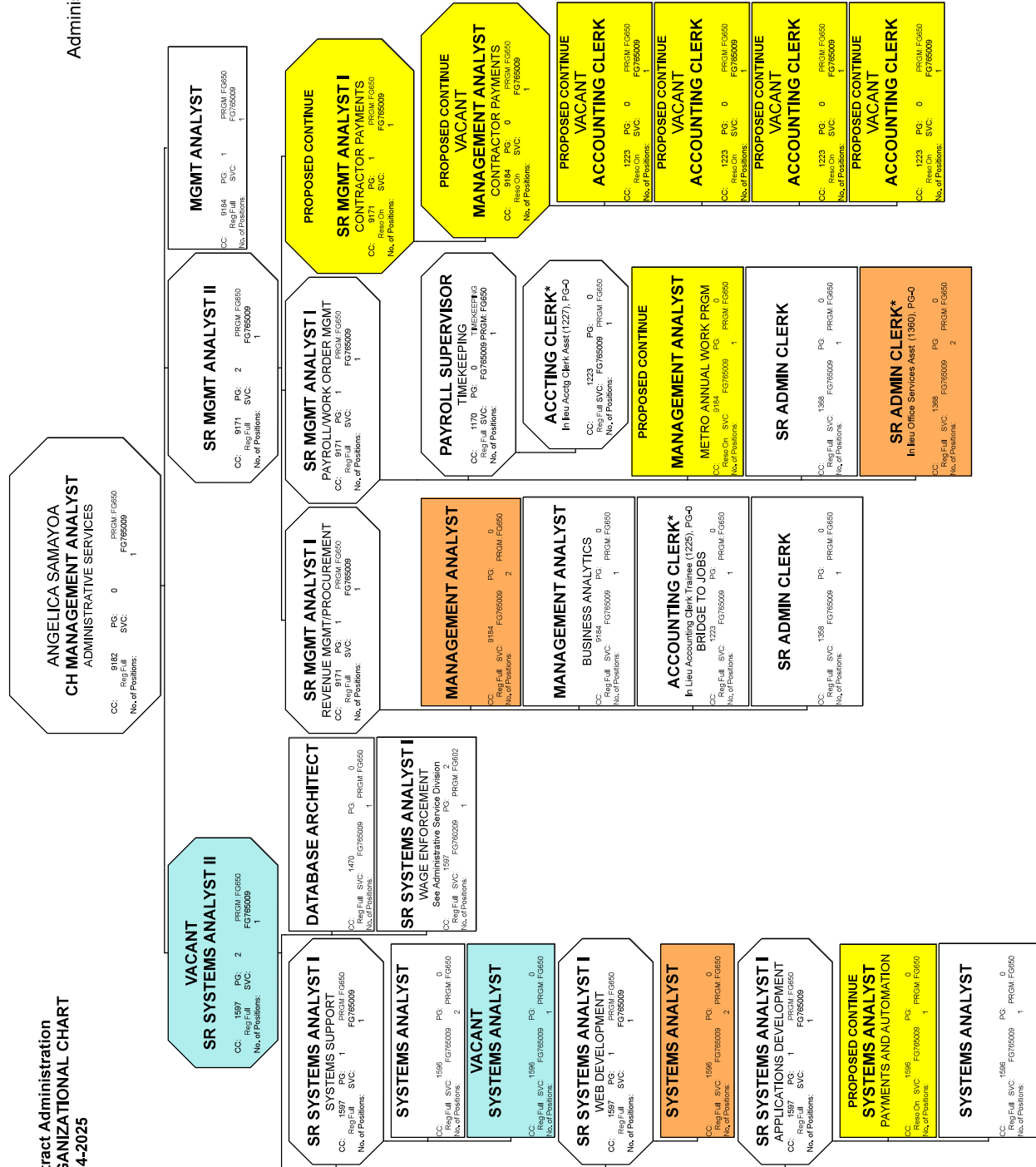

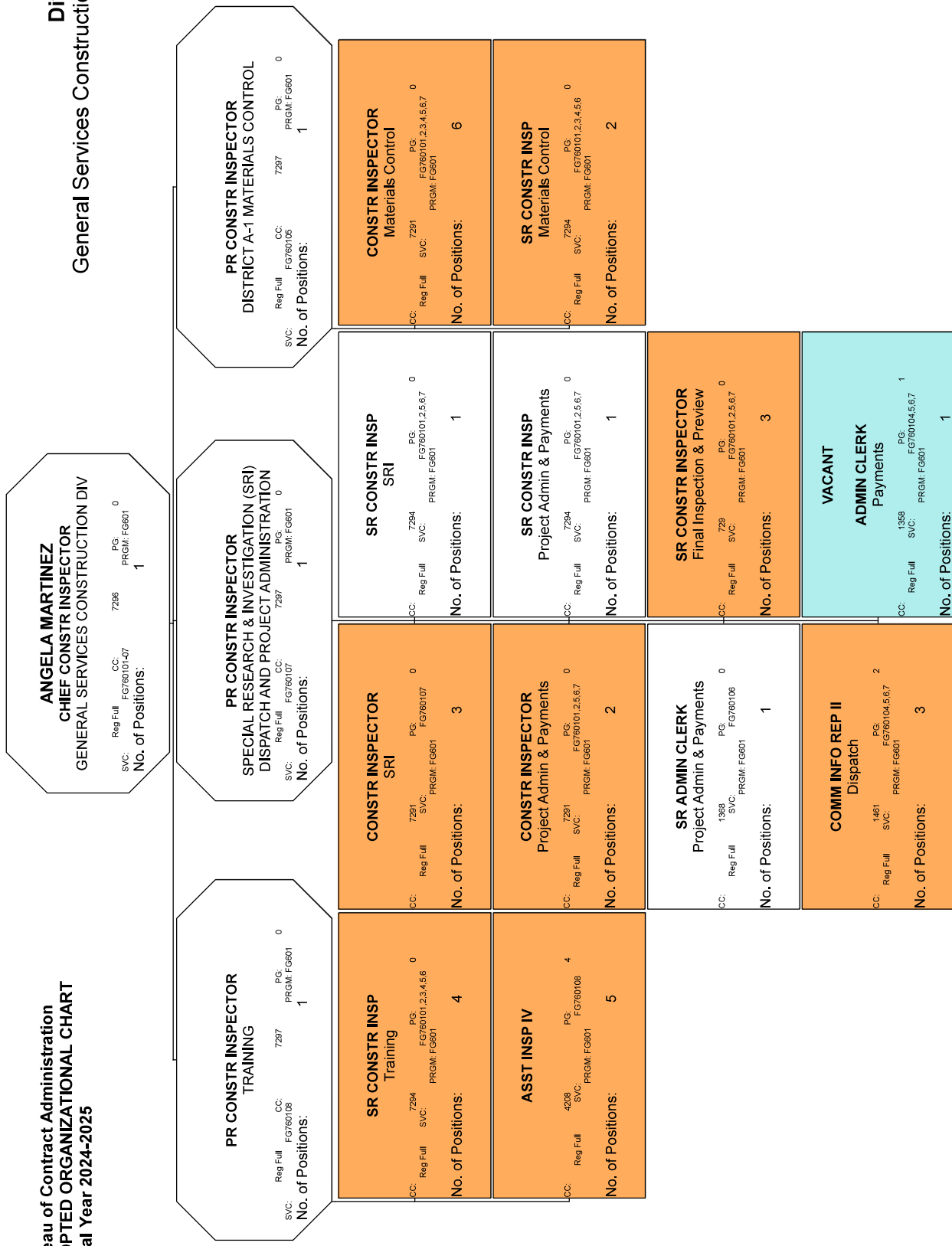
